

What is Streaming? (Plain English)

- Shows and movies arrive through the Internet instead of a cable box.
- You choose what to watch, and when.
- Many apps are FREE; paid ones are month-to-month.
- If you can use a remote,
 you can stream.



You'll need three things:







Smart TV or streaming device



Streaming service provider

Amazon Fire Stick

What You Need

- 1) Internet (included with your Nettles package).
- 2) A Smart TV OR a Fire TV Stick or Apple TV.
- 3) A simple remote (comes with your TV/device).

*** Roku, TCL TVs, Onn (WalMart brand), some Philips TVs, Samsung TVs, some Sharp TVs => Look for Roku label on TV itself – look at remote control for a purple Roku button these TVs cannot get the Blue Stream app



Do I Have a Smart TV?

Look at the Remote Control

- •If you see buttons for **Netflix, Prime Video, YouTube, Hulu, or other apps**, that's a clear sign it's a Smart TV.
- •There may also be a **Home/Menu button** that brings up an on-screen menu of apps.

TV Screen on a Smart TV

- Step 1: Turn on your TV.
 Press HOME on the TV remote.
- Step 2: Look for app tiles like YouTube or Netflix.
- Step 3: If you see apps, you have a Smart TV.
 Otherwise, use a small streaming device.




Choose an Amazon Fire Stick if you have a Samsung TV or Roku based TV (TCL)




Step 1: What's in the Box








Plug end of cable into power adapter.









Plug other end of cable into Fire Stick Plug into an electrical outlet on the wall.






The stick itself plugs directly into an open HDMI port on the back or side of your TV. An optional HDMI extender cable is included if space is tight.





HDMI extender


Find the HDMI port on your TV





HDMI port should be labeled and looks like this.

Plug the Fire Stick alone, or the Fire Stick plus the extender into your TV's HDMI port.



At one point in this video I called it a "Roku stick"....I should have said Fire Stick!



Turn on your TV.




This diagram is included in your box.

Find the remote control that came with your TV.

Switch to the remote control for your TV (not the Fire Stick remote and not the Blue Stream remote!)

Look for a button labeled "input" or "source" or an icon, such as a rectangle with an arrow pointing in, or a box within a box.








Connect the Device to Your TV (One-Time)

Keep pushing the input button until you reach the HDMI selection.



Pair Your Remote


The remote should pair automatically.


If not, press and hold the Home button for 10 seconds.





Step 6: Sign in to Your Amazon Account

- 1. Sign in with your Amazon account email and password.
- 2. If you don't have an Amazon account, create one on-screen.
- 3. Once signed in, your Fire Stick will register to your account.


















Voice Search

- Hold the mic button and say: 'Play I Love Lucy' or 'Open Pluto TV'.
- Release to search. Use arrows and OK to choose a result.



Install FREE Apps (Great to Start)

- 1) Open the device's App Store or Search.
- 2) Type: Pluto, Tubi, Freevee, YouTube.
- 3) Select Install or Add Channel.
- 4) Open the app and start watching.



How to Watch (Everyday Use)

- 1) Press HOME on the streaming remote.
- 2) Select an app (Pluto, Tubi, etc.).
- 3) Highlight a show and press OK/Play.
- 4) Pause, rewind, or fast-forward with the remote buttons.

Troubleshooting (Quick Fixes)

- No picture? Press INPUT on the TV and choose the correct HDMI.
- No Internet? Check Wi-Fi symbol; reboot router (unplug 20 sec).
- Buffering/slow? Pause other downloads; restart the streaming device.
- No sound? Check TV volume/mute; try another HDMI port.

Switching Back to Cable Channels

- 1) Use the TV remote (not the streaming remote).
- 2) Press INPUT/SOURCE and choose 'Cable' (or your cable box input).
- 3) To return to streaming, pick the HDMI for the streaming device.



Glossary (Plain Words)

- App: a channel you install (like Pluto, Tubi, Netflix).
- Wi-Fi: the wireless Internet in your home.
- HDMI: the plug/port carrying picture and sound to your TV.
- Input/Source: tells the TV which device to show.

Free Streaming Apps (Movies & TV Shows)

- Tubi Huge library of movies and TV shows, ad-supported.
- Pluto TV Offers 250+ live TV channels plus on-demand shows/movies.
- Crackle Mix of movies, TV series, and original content.
- Plex Free movies & TV plus live TV channels; also organizes your own media.
- Peacock (Free Tier) NBCUniversal app with movies, TV, and news.
- The Roku Channel Free movies, TV shows, and live channels (works even without a Roku device).
- Freevee (Amazon Freevee) Amazon's free ad-supported streaming service.
- Vudu (Free Section) Free movies and TV episodes with ads.
- Xumo Play Live channels and on-demand movies/TV.

Free Live TV & News Apps

- NewsON Local news stations across the U.S. (live & replay).
- Haystack News Personalized news streaming from many sources.
- ABC News Live 24/7 news stream from ABC.
- CBS News (CBSN) Free 24/7 live news channel.
- Bloomberg TV+ Free streaming news for business/markets.

Free Music & Entertainment

- YouTube Free videos, shows, and music playlists.
- Vevo Music video streaming app.
- iHeartRadio Free music, radio stations, and podcasts.
- Pandora (Free Tier) Streaming music with ads.
